Circle of Courage: Mastery



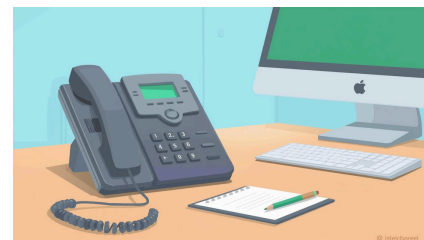
This term we will be focused on the area of Mastery. In January, classes will explore how we become strong learners through these weekly topics:
